Look and live!

As they travelled through desert lands, led by Moses after their escape from Egypt, the people were hungry and thirsty. They complained bitterly to Moses. When a plague of poisonous snakes occurred many died and the people were very afraid. They asked Moses to pray for this plague to end. Moses prayed and the Lord told him to make a metal likeness of a serpent and put it on a pole - so that any one bitten, if they looked at the bronze image, would not die - saved by their believing obedience.

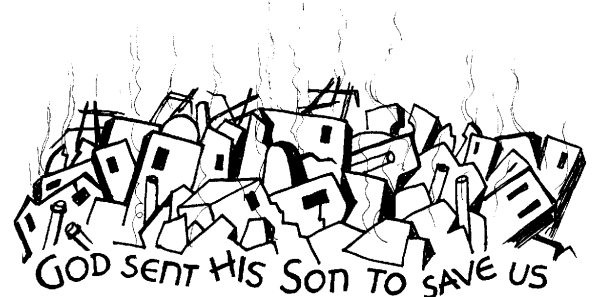
Immeasurable riches - the gift of God
