Romans 10: 8b -13

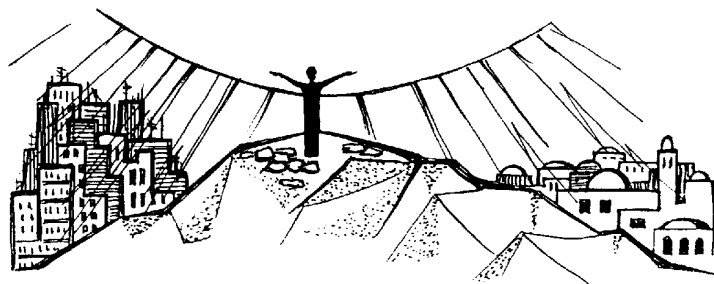
Jesus, Lord of all
